AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRUST FUND FOR BALTIMORE CITY

During the summer over 40 churches, including St. Vincent, responded to the call by United Workers and Housing for All Baltimore to collect signatures to get an affordable housing trust fund for Baltimore City on the ballot in November. More than 18,500 signatures were collected, and now it is known as Question J. This trust fund, if it passes, will support the creation of permanently affordable, community-driven housing in Baltimore.
