Our religious education program for children in grades K-12 is **Faith, Fun Fellowship** (FFF), and it meets on the second and fourth Sundays after 9:30 Mass.

ST. V'S SERVICE MINISTRIES

In the first 11 months of 2016, St. Vincent has:

- **10,688 dinners** on Friday nights
- Given 364 sets of men's clothing
- Provided furnishings for 106 people once homeless
- Distributed 613 bags of groceries
- Given \$2,10 in aid from the Poor Box*



TRUST IN THE SLOW WORK OF GOD

Trusting in the slow work of God is not a modern-day value. Life is fast, and trust is scarce. Our world, our country, our parish all are undergoing transformations that we didn't necessarily choose. And we may well want to skip this "intermediate stage." When such transitions happen, the temptation is to cling to a sense of control rather than accept the anxiety of being in suspense.

And so it is in this moment, as the whirlwind of 2016 closes, that we have chosen as a parish to say this prayer by Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955). We will say it together in Mass and in solidarity at noon each day until Epiphany.

Like us, Teihard lived during a time when the world was undergoing rapid



Though completed by 1940, *The Phenomenon of Man* was published by his secretary after his death, making it a topic for *Time* magazine just our pastor was coming of age. In December 1959, the *Time* article "Toward Omega" caught the attention of the 17-year-old Dick Lawrence, and that Christmas his mother gave him the book. It was a difficult read, but Teilhard's theology, which weaves together the relationship and science, spoke to him. He recently recounted how this book was one of the influences that led him to the priesthood.

As we celebrate 175 years of our parish—a fraction of a nanosecond in God's timeline—this prayer is a reminder that it was God's slow work that brought us to where we are and will take us where we are going.

A Prayer by Pierre Teilhard de Chardin

Above all, trust in the slow work of God.
We are quite naturally impatient in everything to reach the end without delay.
We should like to skip the intermediate stages.
We are impatient of being on the way to something unknown, something new.

And yet it is the law of all progress that it is made by passing through some stages of instability—and that it may take a very long time.

Only God could say what this new spirit gradually forming within you will be.
Give God the benefit of believing that God's hand is leading you, and accept the anxiety of feeling yourself in suspense and incomplete.
